REGULATIONS AND GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Judging will be performed by a panel of judges - appointed by the Tweed River Agricultural Society

All Exhibits must be a bonafide work of the Exhibitor, grown or made by the individual.

Exhibits are to be prepared by non- professionals.

All Entries must have been completed within the last two years and not previously won a prize at the Murwillumbah Show

All exhibits will remain on display until dismantling on Sunday, 4 November when they will be removed under supervision of the steward.

All entries close with the Secretary on Monday 22nd October with the exception of horticulture, which closes 9.00am Friday 2nd November.

No entries will be accepted unless accompanied by payment of the appropriate fees.

No exhibit may compete in more than one class.

Male and female exhibitors may compete in all sections and children are allowed to compete in open classes.

Note: Any application received without payment will not be accepted

Completed Entry Forms must be received by 5.00pm 26th October

ANZAC Cake



INGREDIENTS

125 grams butter cubed, softened
1/2 cup golden syrup
1/4 cup brown sugar
2 x 59g free range eggs lightly whisked
1/2 cup rolled oats
1/2 cup shredded coconut
1 1/2 cups self-raising flour
1 cup milk

ICING

55 grams butter softened
55 grams golden syrup
1/4 cup desiccated coconut
2 cups icing sugar
2 teaspoons boiling water

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat a fan forced oven to 180C.
2. Using an electric mixer, cream the butter, syrup and sugar until light and fluffy. Add the eggs, whisking well after each addition.
3. Fold through the oats, coconut, flour and milk until smooth and combined.
4. Pour into a lined 25cm baking tin and bake for 40 minutes.
5. Using an electric mixer, whisk all icing ingredients until light and fluffy. Pour and spread over the top of the cake.
